This statement is published in line with section 54 (1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015.

Our commitment to the principles of the Modern Slavery Act 2015

The Club is committed to the principles of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and the abolition of modern slavery and human trafficking.

As an equal opportunities employer, we are committed to creating and ensuring a nondiscriminatory and respectful working environment for our staff. We want our staff to feel confident that they can expose wrongdoing without any risk to themselves.

Our recruitment and people management processes are designed to ensure that all prospective employees are legally entitled to work in the UK and to safeguard employees from any abuse or coercion.

We do not enter into business with any organisation, in the UK or abroad, which knowingly supports or is found to be involved in slavery, servitude and forced or compulsory labour.

Our supply chain

Due to the nature of our business, we assess ourselves to have a low risk of modern slavery in our business and supply chains. Our supply chains are limited and we procure goods and services from a range of UK suppliers.

- Ensuring that all staff involved in buying or procurement and the recruitment and deployment of workers receive training on modern slavery and ethical employment practice.
- Making sure the Club procurement strategies and contract terms and conditions include references to modern slavery and human trafficking.
